WELCOME TO PITTSFIELD'S DOWNTOWN ARTS DISTRICT

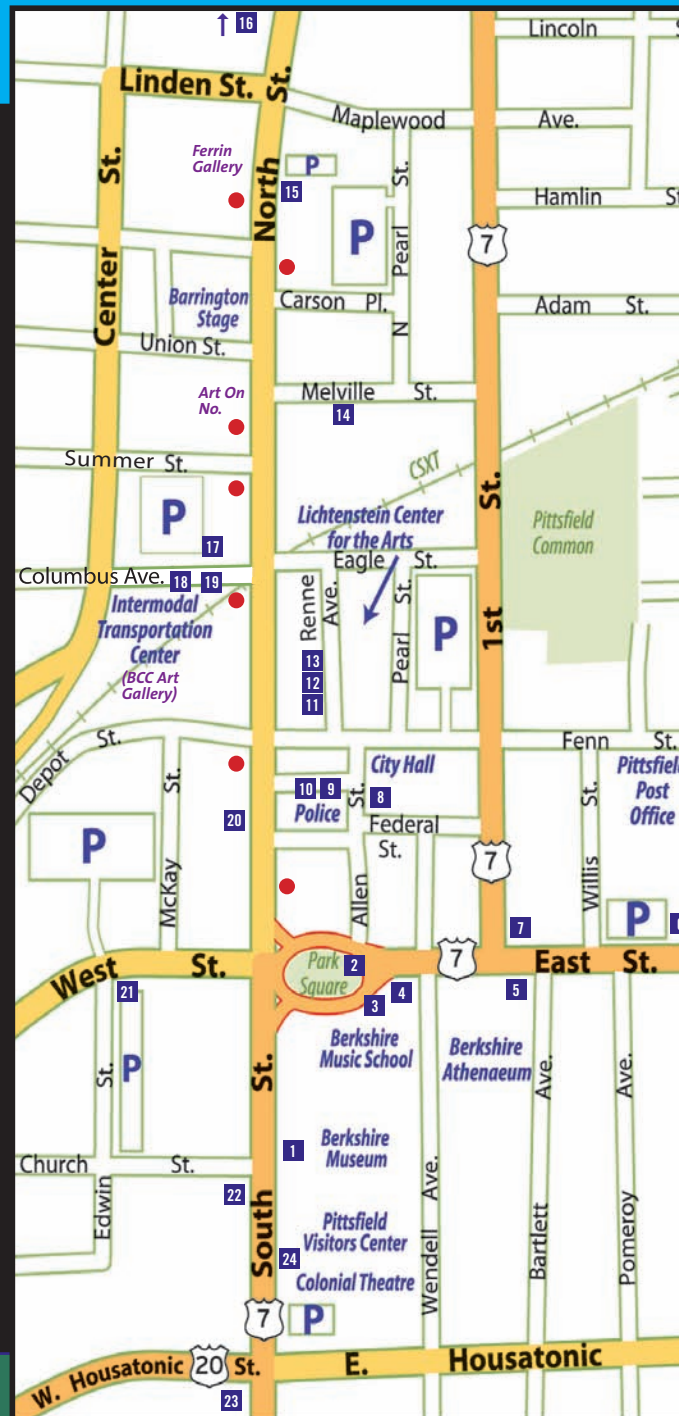
A vital component of any urban landscape, the presence of public art in a community signifies the character of the neighborhood. Downtown Pittsfield has a wealth of public art.
